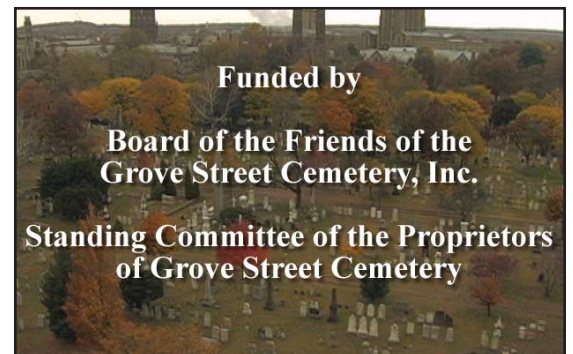
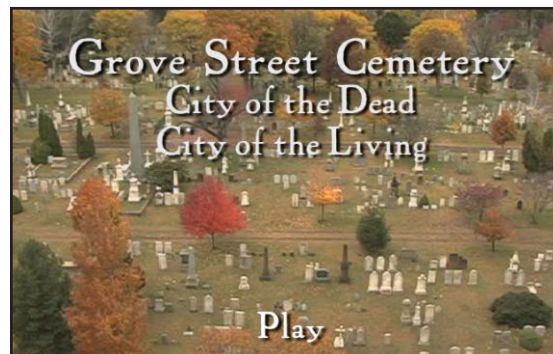
Grove Street Cemetery DVD Now Available for Purchase

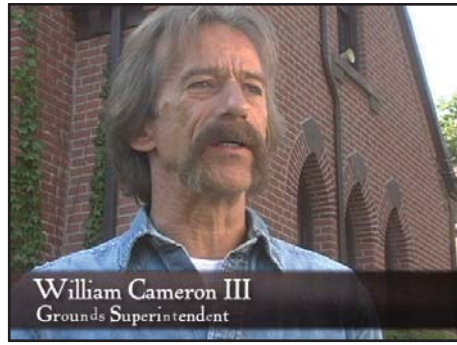
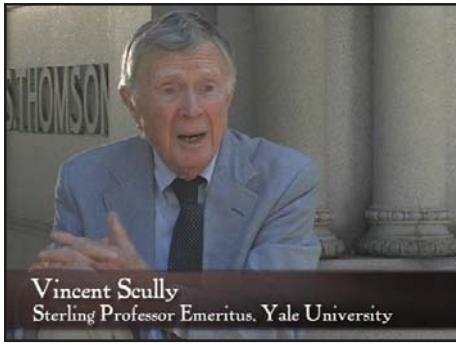
A nearly 30-minute long DVD about the establishment, development, historical significance and the horticulture of the more than 200-year old Grove Street Cemetery, as well as information about some of the notable persons buried there, has been completed and released for sale. Funded jointly by the Standing Committee of the Proprietors of Grove Street Cemetery and the Board of the Friends of the Grove Street Cemetery, Inc., it was produced and directed by 5-time Emmy award winner Karyl Evans. The DVD will have its first public showing on Friday, February 1 – an event for which invitations will be mailed in early January. Special showings of the completed DVD before members of the Board of the Friends organization and the Standing Committee members have met with universal praise.

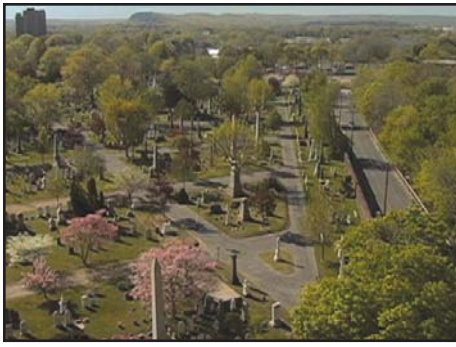


The DVD captures the beauty of the Cemetery in all seasons of the year and includes information about its layout and 'plantings plan' as originally conceived as well as the plan's evolution to the present day. The Friends organization's outreach program to the community through special and school tours as well as general tours open to the public are shown. Through interviews of many individuals associated with or deeply interested in the Cemetery, the viewer learns not only about its beginnings in 1797 but also about the wide range of the over 14,000 people of all races and creeds buried there. Gravestones of some of the country's most prominent scientists, academics, scholars, politicians, and clergy who are interred in the Cemetery are featured. Those who have previewed the DVD have found it both fascinating in its detail and educational in its scope. Grove Street Cemetery is a unique gem of significance to the City, the State and the Nation.
